SAYREVILLE BOARD OF EDUCATION  
RESOLUTION #2006-07-023

WHEREAS, on January 8, 2002, President Bush signed into law the No Child Left Behind (NCLB) Act of 2001, which applies to all school districts and schools within states that accept federal Title I dollars; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Borough of Sayreville, County of Middlesex, State of New Jersey supports the goals of NCLB of raising student achievement, closing the achievement gap, and ensuring that each child has a highly qualified teacher; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Borough of Sayreville, County of Middlesex, State of New Jersey continues to welcome the accountability for improving student and school performance; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Borough of Sayreville, County of Middlesex, State of New Jersey has had four years of operational experience in implementing NCLB; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Borough of Sayreville, County of Middlesex, State of New Jersey has identified improvements that could be made to NCLB that would eliminate barriers to full implementation in the federal law; and

WHEREAS, the National School Boards Association (NSBA) developed draft legislation based on input from local school boards across the nation that would address the concerns of local school boards, and improve the implementation of NCLB; and

WHEREAS, in April 2006 the NSBA Delegate Assembly re-affirmed its support of federal legislation that is consistent with the NSBA draft legislation; and

WHEREAS, in January 2007 Representative Don young (R-AK) re-introduced legislation, the No Child Left Behind Improvements Act of 2007, H.R. 648, that is consistent with the NSBA draft legislation; NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education of the Borough of Sayreville, County of Middlesex, State of New Jersey urges Representative Pallone to fully support H.R. 648 by becoming a co-sponsor of the bill; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Education of the Borough of Sayreville, County of Middlesex, State of New Jersey seeks the support of local community and civic leaders and appropriate members of the New Jersey State Legislature in encouraging Representative Pallone to fully support H.R. 648 by becoming a co-sponsor of the bill; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that copies of this resolution be sent to Representative Pallone, the governor, the members of the New Jersey State Legislature, the Borough of Sayreville Mayor and Council, and New Jersey Commissioner of Education Lucille M. Davy.

## 8 – SUPPORT SERVICES

A. The Board of Education approved the following field trips:

1. On Wednesday, June 6, 2007 nineteen students from the Wilson School and one teacher to Sam's Club in East Brunswick to celebrate the Teacher of the Year award and tour the facility. One Board bus will be utilized at a cost of \$96.87 (salary \$94.87 – fuel \$2.00) to be paid by the Board of Education.
2. On Thursday, June 7, 2007 seven students from the Selover School and one teacher to the Arleth School to acquaint the Project Before students with the kindergarten program. One Board bus will be utilized at a cost of \$101.63 (salary \$99.13 - \$2.50 fuel) to be paid by the Board of Education.
3. On Thursday, June 7, 2007 twenty-five students from the Sayreville High School and three teachers to the Sayreville Police Station and Court House. Students will attend a session of the Sayreville Municipal Court and tour the Sayreville Police Station.
