RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE BOROUGH OF SAYREVILLE IN THE COUNTY OF MIDDLESEX, NEW JERSEY AUTHORIZING CERTAIN ACTIONS IN CONNECTION WITH A PROPOSED DECEMBER 9, 2008 BOND REFERENDUM

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Borough of Sayreville in the County of Middlesex, New Jersey (the "Board"), in the furtherance of its educational goals and constitutional duties to provide a thorough and efficient education, desires to proceed with a bond referendum (the "Bond Referendum") consisting generally of the appropriation of supplemental monies towards the expansion and renovation of the War Memorial High School, which project was approved via a bond referendum approved at the Annual School District Election held on April 19, 2005 and which

supplemental appropriation will be financed through the issuance of bonds; and

WHEREAS, the Board intends to present the Project to the voters via a Bond Referendum at a Special School District Election to be held on December 9, 2008; and

WHEREAS, the Board now seeks to take the initial steps in order to proceed with the Bond Referendum;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE BOROUGH OF SAYREVILLE IN THE COUNTY OF MIDDLESEX, NEW JERSEY, as follows:

Section 1. The Board hereby sets December 9, 2008 as the date for a Special School District Election in order to submit the Bond Referendum to the voters.

Section 2. The Board hereby authorizes and directs the Board President, the Superintendent, the Business Administrator/Board Secretary, and Bond Counsel, as applicable, to take all action required to conduct the Special School District Election including the publication of notices and the providing notice to the appropriate election officials.

Section 3. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
