WHEREAS, the Middlesex Regional Educational Services Commission has agreed to provide the required nursing services for local public school districts for the purpose of efficient delivery of services and greater cost effectiveness through cooperation and centralized administration;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Sayreville Board of Education enter into an agreement with the Middlesex Regional Educational Services Commission whereby the Commission will implement the law and administer the nonpublic school nursing services program for those full-time students enrolled in the nonpublic school, **Our Lady of Victories School**, located within the Sayreville district for the 2008-09 school year, in accordance with applicable law; and

BE IT further resolved that the Sayreville Board of Education shall pay to the Commission 5% as an administrative fee of the entitlement fund received by the Board as state aid, per pupil, pursuant to said enactment.

WHEREAS N.J.S.A. 40A:11-11(5) authorizes contracting units to enter into Cooperative Pricing Agreements; and

WHEREAS the Middlesex Regional Educational Services Commission, hereinafter referred to as the "Lead Agency" has offered voluntary participation in a Cooperative Pricing System for the purchase of work, materials, commodities, and supplies such as two or more participating school districts/municipalities shall agree to; and

WHEREAS, the Sayreville Board of Education, County of Middlesex, State of New Jersey, desires to participate in the Middlesex Regional Educational Services Commission Cooperative Pricing System.
NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED on the 21st day of October, 2008, by the Sayreville Board of Education, County of Middlesex, State of New Jersey, as follows:

TITLE

This RESOLUTION shall be known and may be cited as the Cooperative Pricing System Resolution of the Sayreville Board of Education.

AUTHORITY

Pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:11-11(5), the Business Administrator/Board Secretary is hereby authorized to enter a Cooperative Pricing System Agreement with the Lead Agency.

CONTRACTING UNIT

The Lead Agency entering into contracts on behalf of the Sayreville Board of Education shall be responsible for complying with the provisions of the Public Contracts Law (N.J.S.A. 18A:18A et seq.) and all other provisions of the revised statues of the State of New Jersey. We assume no responsibility to vendors for performance of contracts entered into between the Board of Education/Municipalities and said vendors.

EFFECTIVE DATE

This resolution shall take effect immediately upon passage.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE BOROUGH OF SAYREVILLE IN THE COUNTY OF MIDDLESEX, NEW JERSEY PROVIDING FOR THE SUBMISSION OF A BALLOT QUESTION TO THE SCHOOL DISTRICT VOTERS AT A SPECIAL SCHOOL DISTRICT ELECTION TO BE HELD TUESDAY, DECEMBER 9, 2008

WHEREAS, The Board of Education (the "Board" when referring to the governing body and the "School District" when referring to the territorial boundaries governed by the Board) of the Borough of Sayreville in the County of Middlesex, New Jersey (the "State"), at the annual School District Election held on April 19, 2005, received approval from the voters of the School District to undertake a school facilities project consisting of the expansion and renovation of the War Memorial High School (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, due to unforeseen construction cost increases and delays, the Project cannot be constructed within the original voter approved budget; and

WHEREAS, the Board desires to supplement the costs of the Project; and

WHEREAS, to accomplish the Project, the Board seeks to authorize the submission of a ballot question (the "Proposal") at a special School District election to be held Tuesday, December 9, 2008 (the "Election") and to authorize certain actions required to be taken in connection with the conduct of the Election and the continued undertaking of the Project.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by The Board of Education of the Borough of Sayreville in the County of Middlesex, New Jersey (not less than a majority of the full membership of the Board concurring) as follows:

1. A special School District election (the "Election") of the legal voters of the School District shall be held on Tuesday, December 9, 2008, commencing at 12:00 p.m. in the School District for the purposes hereinafter provided. The polls shall remain open until 9:00 p.m. and as much longer as may be necessary to permit all the legal voters then present to vote and cast their ballot.
2. The following Explanatory Statement and Proposal (the "Proposal") shall be submitted to the legal voters of the School District at the Election:

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

At the annual school district election held on April 19, 2005, the voters approved a school facilities project consisting of the expansion and renovation of the War Memorial High School. The Board had

successfully bid the project and has undertaken the construction of the project. Due to unforeseen construction cost increases and delays, the project cannot be constructed within the original, voter approved budget. The Board has determined that additional funds in an amount not to exceed \$2,200,000 are needed to complete the construction of the project. Such additional amount would be funded through the issuance of bonds.

PROPOSAL

The Board of Education of the Borough of Sayreville in the County of Middlesex, New Jersey is authorized to (A) expend \$2,200,000 to supplement the costs of the expansion and renovation of the War Memorial High School which project was previously approved by the voters of the School District on April 19, 2005; and (B) fund such amount through issuance of bonds in an amount not to exceed \$2,200,000.

3. The Board hereby approves and adopts the Proposal and, subject to the approval of the legal voters of the School District, hereby determines to carry out the same.

4. The Business Administrator/Board Secretary is hereby authorized and directed, in conjunction with Bond Counsel, to deliver a certified copy of this resolution and such other information as shall be necessary to comply with the provisions of all applicable laws to the Middlesex County Superintendent of Schools, Middlesex County Clerk, Middlesex County Board of Elections, and to the Clerk of the Borough of Sayreville and to request such persons to undertake their respective functions under such laws, as applicable, in connection with the Election.

5. The Board hereby acknowledges and confirms that, in accordance with the requirements of Sections 24-16 and 24-17 of the Education Law, a Supplemental Debt Statement has been prepared as of the date of this resolution by the Chief Financial Officers of the Borough of Sayreville, giving effect to the proposed total authorization of School Bonds of the School District in the maximum amount provided for in the Proposal, and that such Supplemental Debt Statement has been filed in the office of the Clerk of the Borough of Sayreville, and in the office of the Business Administrator/Board Secretary prior to the adoption of this resolution. The Board hereby directs the Business Administrator/Board Secretary to cause such Supplemental Debt Statement to be filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, New Jersey Department of Community Affairs prior to the date of the Election.

6. The School Administration and such other officers, professionals and agents of the Board as are necessary, including Wilentz, Goldman & Spitzer, P.A., Bond Counsel and the Architect for the Project, are each hereby authorized and directed to perform such acts, execute such documents and do such things as are necessary and proper for the submission of the Proposal to the voters of the School District at the Election. The Business Administrator/Board Secretary, in consultation with Bond Counsel, is hereby authorized to revise the Proposal in order to conform same to statutory requirements.

7. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

3. I will confine my board action to policy making, planning and appraisal and I will help to frame policies and plans only after the board has consulted those who will be affected by them.
4. I will carry out my responsibility, not to administer the schools, but, together with my fellow board members, to see that they are well run.

5. I will recognize that authority rests with the Board of Education and will make no personal promises nor take any private action that may compromise the board.
6. I will refuse to surrender my independent judgment to special interest or partisan political groups or to use the schools for personal gain or for the gain of friends.
7. I will hold confidential all matters pertaining to the schools, which, if disclosed, would needlessly injure individuals or the schools. In all other matters, I will provide accurate information and, in concert with my fellow Board Members, interpret to the staff the aspirations of the community for the school.
8. I will vote to appoint the best-qualified personnel available after consideration of the recommendation of the chief administrative officer.
9. I will support and protect school personnel in proper performance of their duties.
10. I will refer all complaints to the chief administrative officer and will act on the complaints at public meetings only after failure of an administrative solution.
