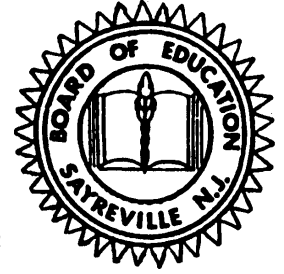

EMMA L. ARLETH SCHOOL STUDENTS AND STAFF

During the month of February, Emma Arleth Elementary School collected \$1,900 in spare change for the Leukemia & Lymphoma Society School and Youth Program. The Leukemia & Lymphoma Society is the world's largest voluntary health organization dedicated to funding blood cancer research, education and patient services. Their mission is to cure leukemia, lymphoma, Hodgkin's disease and myeloma and improve the quality of life for patients and their families. Arleth's school nurse, Judith Berg-Friel, R.N., coordinated this school fundraiser. Mrs. Comerford's third-grade class brought in the highest amount of spare change with Ms. Lyon's second-grade class coming in second. All of the money collected will help local patients and thousands of others fight blood cancers. Leukemia causes more deaths than any other cancer among children and young adults under the age of 20.
