Dear Parents and Students,

Help celebrate American Education Week (Nov. 16-22) by participating in a contest sponsored by the Sayreville Education Association. The contest, which is organized by SEA's Pride in Education committee, awards prizes to the contest winners at a reception in January. This year's theme, "Great Public Schools: A Basic Right and Our Responsibility" reflects the Association's calling upon America to provide students with quality schools so that they can grow, prosper, and achieve in the 21st century.

Our topic this year is, "Education can bring you to new heights!" With this in mind, below are the guidelines to follow for entering the contest:

1. Each student may submit one entry.
2. The entry should be any type of kite. It is suggested that a heavier paper such as cardstock or oak tag be used no larger than 11" x 14". (without the tail)
3. The kite can be decorated with different kinds of art materials including but not limited to fabric, paints, glitter, rubber stamping, colored glue, cut-out shapes, lettering and pictures.
4. Students will submit all entries to their teachers by Nov. 28th. There will be one winner per grade level throughout the district. Winner will be awarded a fifty dollar (\$50.00) bond.
5. Students should put their name, teacher's name, grade level and school on the back of the entry.
