- The students and staff of Truman Elementary School attended The Seeing Eye assembly in March and in April continued with this program and are now participating in a fundraiser for the Seeing Eye Dog Organization called *Pennies for Puppies*, under the direction of Ms. Jennifer Swenticky and Ms. Kate Zebrowski. This organization was pleased to have Truman Elementary School participate in this wonderful program and have chosen a puppy for Truman to sponsor. The puppy's name is Clancy, an 8–9 week old chocolate Labrador Retriever. The funds collected through the *Pennies for Puppies Program* will allow Clancy to live with a family of his very own for the next 12–14 months as part of the Puppy Raising Program. During that time, he will receive love, gentle guidance, socialization, and exposure in preparation for his formal training, which begins immediately following the completion of the Puppy Raising Program. Once Clancy completes his formal training, he will be matched with a person who is visually impaired. Truman School will receive updates on Clancy as he embarks on this wonderful journey to make a difference in the lives of others.
