Academic Achievement

This school outperforms **66%** of schools statewide as noted by its statewide percentile and **97%** of schools educating students with similar demographic characteristics as noted in its peer school percentile in the performance area of [Academic Achievement. Additionally, this school is meeting **100%** of its performance targets in the area of Academic Achievement.

College and Career Readiness

This school outperforms 42% of schools statewide as noted by its statewide percentile and 71% of schools educating students with similar demographic characteristics as noted in its peer school percentile in the performance area of College and Career Readiness. Additionally, this school is meeting 0% of its performance targets in the area of College and Career Readiness. Academic Achievement measures the content knowledge students have in language arts literacy and math. For elementary and middle schools, this includes measures of the school's proficiency rate on both the Language Arts Literacy and Math sections of the New Jersey Assessment of Skills and Knowledge (NJASK). A proficiency rate is calculated by summing the count of students who scored either proficient or advanced proficient on the assessment and dividing by the count of valid test scores.

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College and Career readiness measures the degree to which students are demonstrating behaviors that are indicative of future attendance and/or success in college and careers. For all elementary and middle schools, this includes a measurement of how many students are chronically absent. For schools with middle school grades, it also includes a measurement of how many students take Algebra I in eighth grade.



Enrollment by Grade












This graph presents the percentage of students who scored in the Advanced Proficient, Proficient and Partially Proficient categories of the statewide Math assessment over the prior four years.




Chronic Absenteeism Trend
