- B. By June 2016, the Superintendent will lead the implementation of strategies designed to increase the percentage of students who achieve proficiency on the 2015–16 Grades 3-8 PARCC Math Assessment as compared to the 2014-15 PARCC Math Assessment results, as demonstrated by an increase in performance through a merit goal attainment tiered evaluation method.
- A. By June 2016, the Superintendent will lead the implementation of strategies designed to increase the percentage of students who achieve proficiency on the pparcc2015-16 grade 11 PARCC language arts and math assessment as compared to 2014-15 PARCC language arts and math assessment results, as demonstrated by an increase in performance through a merit goal attainment tiered evaluation method.
- B. By June 2016, the Superintendent will lead the implementation of strategies designed to increase the total average student SAT Language Arts score for students who take the assessment in 2015-16 as compared to 2014-15, as demonstrated by an increase in performance through a merit goal attainment tiered evaluation method.
- C. By June 2016, the Superintendent will lead the implementation of strategies designed to increase the total average student SAT Math score for students who take the assessment in 2015-16 as compared to 2014-15, as demonstrated by an increase in performance through a merit goal attainment tiered evaluation method.
- D. By June 2016, the Superintendent will lead the implementation of strategies designed to increase the performance of advanced placement students as evidenced by a composite increase in assessment results in 2015-16 compared to 2014-15 results, as demonstrated by an increase in performance through a merit goal attainment tiered evaluation method.
- A. By June 2016, the Superintendent will research and implement alternate sources of funding, which is not limited to the inclusion of advertising revenue for the 2015-16 school year, will analyze and will lead SEMI implementation and will review facility usage, tuition for non-resident students, and advertising for the 2015-16 school year as compared to revenue produced during the 2014-15 school year
- B.
