Staff Results Highlights

- Class sizes are too large.
- Staff feels that schools are clean and safe and take pride in building appearance.
- Staff and students are safe in hallways, bathrooms, and classrooms.
- Students are well behaved, but teachers feel that they spend too much of teaching time on disciplining students.
- Students in schools respect each other's differences (for example, gender, race, culture, etc.).
- School community has high expectations for student behavior.
- Teachers do not have the tools they need and are dissatisfied with professional development.

- Teachers feel that they do not have enough time to collaborate or prepare for lessons.
- Nearly 70% of staff looks forward to coming to work and feel that their school is a good place for them to work and learn.
- Teachers are treated and respected as educational professionals.
- Administrators give useful feedback on teaching.
- Administrators recognize teachers for a job well-done.
- Administrators follow through on commitments.
- Administrators involve teachers in decision making and problem solving.
- Administrators promote the success of all students.
- Administrators hold themselves to the same high expectations as others.

Parent Results Highlights

- Overall, parents are very satisfied with their child's school.
- The school environment is clean and in good condition.
- Children are safe at school and when going to and from school.
- The learning environment is excellent.
- The rules for student behavior are fair.
- Communication with families occurs in an open and respectful manner.
- The teachers are excellent and set high standards for students.
- The academic needs of students are met and their performance has improved.
- Parents feel welcomed and are actively involved in the school and in making important school decisions.
- Parents are well-informed about how their child is doing in school.

Student Results Highlights
