FINANCE

1. The Superintendent recommends and so moves the Board of Education of Sayreville to approve the Proposed Budget for Fiscal Year 2021-2022 for submission as follows:

WHEREAS, during the public hearing held on May 4, 2021, the Board of Education discussed the 2021-2022 School District Budget and provided opportunity for public comment and at each Board meeting where the Board discussed the 2021-2022 Budget from December 15, 2020 through March 16, 2021; and

WHEREAS, the 2021-2022 School District Budget requires the use of Capital Reserve Funds for capital improvements in the amount of \$1,163,219.00; and

WHEREAS, the 2021-2022 School District Budget requires the use of Maintenance Reserve Funds for facility maintenance improvements in the amount of \$536,781.00; and

WHEREAS, the school district policy (Expenses - #9250) and N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-7.3 provides that the Board of Education shall establish in the annual school budget a maximum expenditure for the 2021-2022 school year; and

WHEREAS, that the Sayreville Board of Education hereby establishes the school district travel maximum for the 2021-2022 school year at the sum of \$45,300.00 and be it further resolved that the School Business Administrator shall track and record these costs to ensure that the maximum is not exceeded. Current 2020-2021 school-year expenditures are \$2,962.15 and the budget is \$50,300.00; and

WHEREAS, the 2021-2022 Budget Comparison with Justification Reports include the supporting documentation for this 2021-2022 Budget and also contains an itemization of certain expenditures and revenues required under administrative regulations; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Sayreville Board of Education adopt the Proposed Budget for Fiscal Year 2021-2022 for the School District General Fund Budget of \$103,727,010.00, including a local tax levy \$65,707,345.00; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Sayreville Board of Education adopt a Proposed Budget for fiscal school year 2021-2022 for the school district special revenue fund budget of \$12,634,370.00; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Sayreville Board of Education adopt a Proposed Budget for fiscal school year 2021-2022 for the school district debt service fund budget of \$3,615,196.00, including a local tax levy \$3,535,693.00.

2. The Superintendent recommends and so moves the Board of Education of Sayreville to approve the following resolution:

- Learning Tree to provide Bilingual Speech, Psychological, and Learning evaluations per fee schedule, not to exceed \$15,000.00.
- Meridian Pediatrics to provide Neurologic Evaluations at a rate of \$175.00 per evaluation, not to exceed \$18,000.00.
- NJ Care to provide Applied Behavior Analysis and Crisis Prevention Intervention Services at a rate of \$120.00/hour, not to exceed \$185,000.00.
- Aida Pereira to provide Bilingual Speech Language Evaluation Services per fee schedule, not to exceed \$2,000.00.
- Matthew J. Speesler, MD., to provide Professional Services to include Medical Interpretation feedback and advice pertaining to employee health, home instruction cases, not to exceed \$8,000.00.

- Star Pediatric Home Care Agency to provide Nursing Services at a rate of \$59.00/hour for RN Services and \$49.00/hour for LPN services, not to exceed \$20,000.00.
- Summit Speech School to provide Itinerant Services at a rate of \$165.00/hour, not to exceed \$130,000.00.

3. The Superintendent recommends and so moves the Board of Education of Sayreville to approve the maximum allowable cost for an independent evaluation to be the reasonable and customary rate of \$800.00 per evaluation, for the 2021-2022 school year.

4. The Superintendent recommends and so moves the Board of Education of Sayreville to rescind the contract with Unique Musique Entertainment, Inc. for supplies and services related to hosting the Senior Prom, Junior Prom and 8th Grade Dance.

5.
